



Contributing to a Section 42 enquiry

Course Title	Contributing to s42 Care Act enquiries
Course Audience	Multi-Agency course open to anyone who would be asked to contribute to a section 42 enquiry – usually at a supervisory level. This is a multi-agency course with representatives from Borough and District councils, Registered Managers of Care/ Nursing Homes, Registered Managers of Domiciliary Care Agencies, GP's and Health colleagues.
Attendees	The course is limited to 20 candidates per session
Pre-requisite	Safeguarding Essentials (or equivalent) 1 day course
Pre-reading	SCIE – Information Sharing
Aims & Objectives	<p>By the end of the course delegates will have an improved understanding of s42 Care Act enquiries, and the role of s42 enquiries in facilitating improvements in care. Delegates will understand their organisations role in supporting enquiries under s42 of the Care Act and have the opportunity (through the use of a case study) to follow a safeguarding concern from receipt in the MASH through completion of a quality report.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Improved understanding of the remit and purpose of adult safeguarding across organisations. • Understanding the multi-agency process following submission of a safeguarding concern and the roles involved in progressing a safeguarding enquiry. • Understanding and utilising key legislation which aids and supports sharing information. • Developing knowledge of models used for root cause analysis and how to employ these effectively as part of the investigative process. • Developing the skills needed to provide appropriate and relevant information to partners. • Understanding the importance of working in partnership in order to improve outcomes for the person. • Improving the confidence of practitioners to engage in constructive dialogue with partners to achieve clarity of understanding across organisational boundaries.
