

# MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

**Meeting date: Thursday 26 September 2019**

## **Health and Wellbeing Board**

The Health and Wellbeing Board (HWB) manager attended to provide the SAB with an update on the [Surrey Health and Wellbeing Strategy](#).

The Strategy priorities are:

- Helping people in Surrey to lead healthy lives
- Supporting people in Surrey to fulfil their potential
- Supporting the emotional wellbeing of people in Surrey

The Surrey Health and Wellbeing Strategy is also the 10 year plan for Surrey Heartlands. The Surrey Health and Wellbeing Board oversees the strategy which will be delivered by health and care partners across Surrey, including the NHS, Surrey County Council, boroughs and districts, voluntary sector, community and faith sectors and others.

The strategy focuses on a single set of agreed priorities for the county where they can work together to improve outcomes as a partnership.

As the Surrey Heartlands Integrated Care System (ICS) is entirely within the county of Surrey, this strategy will form the core of its response to the NHS Long-Term plan. This strategy will also form part of the separate submissions made by both East Surrey and Sussex sustainability and transformation partnership (STP) and Frimley ICS in their responses to the NHS Long-Term plan.

It also allows the Board to ensure alignment where appropriate on our strategies.

## **Safeguarding concerns referral process and Levels of Need**

Work has been actioned by SCC to improve the decision making within the ASC MASH team which referrals from the emergency services should be treated as adult safeguarding concerns. A level of need tool was developed in the MASH to help police within MASH.

To support this the 'level of need' document was created, and has been rolled out to Police and SECamb. The level of need tool helps those submitting a referral decide where the referral is most appropriate – to the MASH or the Contact centre.

## **SECamb update**

The board was updated on the positive progress of their action plan.

## **Pressure Ulcer Protocol**

The CCG have been working to make the national paper into to a similar Surrey document. The Surrey document will not be replacing the national paper, but to be used alongside your professional judgement.

### **Training update**

SSAB board members were updated on the current status of the current training options open to them from SSAB.

### **S75 Agreement**

An update was given on the section 75 agreement between ASC and SABP, as SSAB had some concerns for those using the service and how this would affect them and asked for both parties for assurance during the change

### **LGA/ ADASS Guidance**

ASC presented a document to update the SAB on Applying the LGA “Making decisions on the duty to carry out Safeguarding Adults enquiries” framework in Surrey.

The report is the result of work commissioned by ADASS to understand what lay behind the wide variation in rates of adult safeguarding concern, enquiries and the rate of conversion from one to another that were reported by LAS in the NHS Digital Safeguarding Adults Collection (SAC) data.

### **Awareness raising materials**

The SAB have commissioned awareness raising material which have now been published and are available on the [SAB website](#).

### **National Safeguarding Week**

In preparation for National Safeguarding Week SAB have commissioned comms materials to run alongside any events partners may be running.

Resource packs are being distributed to acute trusts, District and Borough councils and community hospitals.

Emails will be circulated to partner organisations asking them to support the SAB and publish the social media campaigns on their social media channels.

Emails with the banners, screen saver, postcards and posters will also be circulated and are also available on the [SAB website](#).

During National Safeguarding Week, SAB have also commissioned Surrey police to provide a half days training course on Hate Crime. The training will take place on Tuesday 19 November. More information can be found on the SAB website under National Safeguarding Week.

### **SSAB Annual Report**

The SAB annual report was reported at the September Cabinet meeting which was agreed. Following this the annual report was presented to SAB member for sign off/ approval.

### **ASC Qualitative data**

Qualitative data from Adult Social Care and Mental Health quality assurance information was discussed to allow the Board to get assurance and where gaps highlighted, agree remedies for action to address.
