Joint Domestic Homicide Review/ Safeguarding Adults Review
‘Monro’

The Surrey Safeguarding Adults Board (SSAB) has in partnership with the Runnymede community Safety partnership today published the findings of a joint Domestic Homicide Review (DHR)/ Safeguarding Adult Review (SAR) in relation to Monro.

This review was jointly commissioned to ensure that there was an independent oversight of the circumstances surrounding the death of Monro. The review does not seek to apportion blame but to consider the way agencies worked together to support Monro and to look at what lessons can be learned to assist those facing similar situations in the future.

Monro’s family and friends have suffered a great loss, and we thank those who shared their memories of Monro and contributed to this review.

As well as highlighting areas of good practice, the review identified important learning and key areas for further improvement both locally and nationally.

The recommendations are accepted in full; and agencies who had worked with Monro will share and embed this learning within their agency and the wider system. Involved agencies will be held to account and assurance will be sort that the recommendations are implemented, and the impact of changes are monitored, to ensure that others are protected in the future.
